War brings with it a call to national service for women as well as men. There are two very important ways in which women can help the nation in war, thereby releasing men for the front: 1) by working in industry, and 2) by joining the American Red Cross.

There is little consolation for Germany over the results of Tuesday's registration. Over 10 million men between ages 21 and 30 answered to their country's call as eligible for enlistment.

Dr. W.E. Chapman of Cheboygan, deputy state health officer, was in Mackinaw City this week and pronounced the disease prevalent among the children around town, scarlet fever, and the home of R. Wheeler on DePeyster street, was quarantined, and the

school closed for the remainder of the week. If no further cases develop, school will open Monday.

Capt. James Bennett, who has spent the winter in Detroit, returned to the Island Tuesday on the D&C to get Bennett Hall in readiness for the season.

Preliminary diagnosis of the injuries disclosed for four fractured ribs, a deflated lung, and internal bleeding. He required three transfusions.
